Hand To become a Green Hand the student must be fourteen years of age or the mental equivalent enfolled in an all-day course in agriculture, possess suitable facilities for carrying out satisfacory supervised farm practice and receive a majority of the votes of the members of the local chapter.

To be elected to the degree of Farmer the student must have completed one year's work in argraviture including satisfactory superivsed farm practice, at least \$50.00 earned and on deposit or otherwise productively invested, regularly enrolled in an all-day class with plans for an enlarge program of supervised farm practice, lead the class in a five five minute discussion when called upon to do so, recite to memory the Country Boy's Creed and receive majority of votes from the members of the chapter.

Carolina Farmer. The qualifications for the degree of Carolina Farmer, the highest rank in the organization as as follows: The student must have completed at least two years of agriwith outstanding surjervised farm practice, at least \$300.00 earned and on deposit or otherwise productively invested, be able to lead a group successfully for twenty minutes, possess outstanding qualities of leadership, make the high school judging, or debating team, make an average grade, of eighty-five or more pass a subject matter test on agricul-ture given by the state supervisory staff, and be familiar with parlia-mentary procedure by having held ffice in the local chapter. The members for this degree will be elected annually at the state meeting, the number receiving degrees each year being limited to twenty-five
