old competitive system. Whether a change in policy means that the end of the NRA is in sight or not, two things are apparent: 1. The codes of fair competition have done much to restore a degree of prosperity to the nation, and 2. There have been many violations and much eye-winking that have gone unpunished since its inauguration. Perhaps it has served its purpose, and if so should be revolutionized into something of a more permanent nature or fled away in the annals of history.

Even the selling of this year's tobacco crop has its funny side. In 1932 if tobacco averaged as much as twelve cents in a day's sale the warehouseman was, to a degree, pleased. In 1933 if it averaged as much as twenty cents he couldn't keep from grinning all over himself when he talked about it. And just the other day we were talking to a warehouseman and in the course of our conversation we asked him what his house averaged for that day's sale. His reply was that he didn't do so good because his average was just a little better than thirty cents. Were we given to moralizing we might point out that some folks never seem to be satisfied, but the higher tobacco gets, the nearer all of piedmont North Carolina and Virginia will come to being satisfied. After all, it's bread and meat to all of us.

Heavy rains have damaged the Nash County cotton crop and some farmers are demanding a re-check of their acreage where compliance measurements have shown too much cotton planted.
