

NEW FOUR-DOOR STAND'D SEDAN ADDED TO LINE

For the first time since Chevrolet added the standard six in 1933, a four-door five-passenger sedan is now included in its lowest priced line. In announcing the new model as an addition to the 1934 Standards, Chevrolet Motor Company declares it to be the lowest priced four-door sedan in the field of sixes and eights. Its list price is \$540, or \$100 under the Master four-door sedan.

The major new feature in styling is the treatment of the rear end, where the body panels extend low in an unbroken contour to cover the back of the chassis. This construction does away with the rear cross-member cover, and provides a smooth, sweeping effect. The rear carrier and the rear bumper extend through opening in the body panel, as does the gasoline filler-neck.

Comfort for rear seat passengers is provided by provision for extra room, the back of the front seat is deeply recessed, giving plenty of space for a built-up foot rest. An elbow room is obtained by means of deep recesses in the body above large arm rests. A spacious pocket in the front seat is an added convenience. Upholstery is of material of a new shade and texture, set off by harmonizing color-lining.
