Hill 2 yards L. E. and T. Daniel tries L. E. for 1 1/2 yards. when he is downed by Merritt by one of the most beautiful tackles ever seen on a field, Daniel tries L. E. and T. for 1/2 yards, tries same play for no gain, breaks centre for 2 1/2 yards; then L. E. and T. for 3 yards. Gore tries R. E. for one yard. Daniel L. E. M. for 1 1/2 yards, he tries again and loses—the ball goes over. Baskerville punts to Daniel who is downed by Mearitt before he can return the kick. Pugh sprains his ankle but keeps on playing. Hill tries L. G. and T. for two yards. Daniel 1 1/2 yards around L. E. Hill tries the centre for no gain, ball goes over. Whedbee R. E. and T. 4 yards. and around R. E. 15 yds. Kenan makes 1 1/2 yards through L. E. and T. Whedbee R. E. and T. for 5 yds. Little makes 1 1/2 yds through L. E. and T. Kenan 6 yards through L. E. and T. Baskerville breaks the centre and aided by Snipes beautiful opening carries the ball 15 yds. for a touch down. Time 4 minutes. Barnard kicks goal. Score 36-0.

Wake Forest gains 10 yards on a V they then send Gore through L. G. and T, for 1 1/2 yards. On an off side by Merritt Wake Forest gets 5 yds. Daniel R. G. and T. 1/2 yard. Daniel R. E. 7 yards. Daniel breaks R. G. and T. for 1 1/2 yards, gets the wind and grit knocked out of him but plays on, He tries to break the line but fails to gain—ball goes over. Kenan takes the ball around L. E. for six yards. Sykes downing him by a beautiful tackle. Wheedbee tries R. E. and T, for 5 yards. Kenan goes around right end aided by beautiful interference for 35 yards. Whedbee makes 4 yds. right end and tackle. Baskerville 4 yards R. G. and C. Kenan 10 yards L. E. Wheedbee loses 3 1/2 yards R. E. Little makes 4 1/2 yds L. G. and T. Wheedbee takes the ball and aided by Guion's interference makes 11 yards. Kenan 8 1/2 yards L. E. Baskerville goes through left guard and center for 2 1/2 yards; he repeats for 2 1/2 yards. does the same thing for three yards. Wheedbee follows suit and makes a touch down. Time 18 minutes. Barnard fails to kick goal. Score 40 to 0 in favor of University.

A. & M. starts ball from center of field with flying V. but loses on a fumble but soon regains it on four downs. Ball kicked by Hughs, Denson gets ball and makes a beautiful run of 30 yds. before being downed. Dockrey, Denson and Webb then advance the ball steadily up to Agricultural and Mechanical's five yard line. Dockery makes touch down, Denson kicks goal. Score 6 — 0. Time 12 minutes. A & M. then starts V center of field, and by hard rushing advanced the ball to within six inches of Carolina's goal, and here the 'Varsity boys make a beautiful brace and take the ball in four downs. Webb passes ball to full back for a kick out of danger but Vick blocks the ball and Pritchard falls on it behind the line scoring a touch down. Hughs fails to kick goal. Score 6—4. Neither side scored again during the first half. The only thing worthy of mention was a beautiful tackle by McRae.

SECOND HALF.

Toward beginning of this half, McKinne is hurt, Weaver takes his place. Now Denson and Weaver run together, and Weaver retires in favor of Falls. A. & M. advances ball up the field and a succession of kicks by Hughs and fumbles and muffs by Webb F. B.

Near the last of this half and with only about a yard between A. & M. and a touch down, the 'Varsity boys take the ball again, and Webb bucks the center for 12 yards, but loses the ball and Whitaker scores touch down for A. & M. Hughes fails to kick goal. Score 8—6.
