Never in the history of foot ball at the University has a foot ball team suffered more hardships and accidents than the gallant eleven which for the past two months have been battling for the "white and blue" Taking all things into consideration the team of '93 equaled the victorious one of '92. After comparing the record of '92 with that of '93, we find that in '92, it was the same eleven that won all her victories. In all of our games last year, there was only one substitute played; with the team of '93 matters were far different, not in but one game did the team line up intact, and that was with Wake Forest In all there have been twelve substitutes played in the games this year. It untorseen casualties had not taken place, and we had been possessed of the same good fortune of last year, there is no doubt but the result would have been different. We know the team has done its duty and we are proud of them, though we are not as gratified as we would have been if the team had been victorious. We played under disadvantages this year, which outsiders cannot realize, but no matter how badly all were crippled, our team met the enemy and filled their engagements. Capt. Barnard did good work this year, with the nine under him, but it was impossible for him or any other man to take the crippled team we have had this year and win. Early in the season, Furgerson one of our best ends was laid off, he only played in one game, Snipes was laid off in two games, Merritt in four, Murphy in two and the most of the team in same porportion. The only men who have played in all our games, have been Kirkpatrick, Pugh

Little, Barnard and Baskerville. Here is to the team of '93, though success has not been yours, you have fought a gallant fight and we are proud of you.
