BASE-BALL.

N. C. Defeats the Richmond College Boys.

The game of ball played between the U. N. C. team and the Richmond College boys at West End Park, in Richmond, on Monday, May 7, resulted in an easy victory for Carolina.

The N. C. boys went into the game with their characteristic over confidence, and played with no snap whatever in the early part of the game. In fact, they played such poor ball that they were shut out by the Virginians until the fifth inning.

Ellyson pitched a good game; the boys did not dig in to him till the sixth inning.

The game was called at 4.40 P. M., with Richmond College at the bat. Phillips hits line ball to Stanley, and on error gets first. Duke, W., makes base-hit over third, tries to go to second and is thrown out by Graham. Phillips scores. Ellyson hits grounder to Stephens and is thrown out at first.

N. C.—Robertson, W., hits to short and is out at first. Oldham, base on balls. Lanier sacrifices Oldham to second. Gregory flies out to right field. Score—Richmond College, 1; N. C., 0.

SECOND INNING.—Acree hits to Stephens and is thrown out at first. Johnson flies out to Gregory. Harrison strikes out.

N. C.—Honeycutt goes out on foul fly to Burnett. Kenan out on ground ball to Phillips. Stanley reaches first on Burnett's error. Graham out on ground ball to Ellyson. Score—Richmond, 1; N. C., 0.

THIRD INNING.—Duke, F., out on pop-up fly to Gregory. Lockett hits grounder to Stephens and is thrown out at first. Phillips flies out to Stanley.

N. C.—Stephens strikes out. Robertson, W., strikes out. Oldham, base on balls. Lanier out on ground ball to Acree. Score—Richmond College, 1; N. C., 0.

FOURTH INNING.—Duke, W., bunts safely and reaches first. Burnett out on sacrifice hit to Gregory. Ellyson hits to right center for two bases, Duke, W., scoring. Acree hits single to center, scoring Ellyson. Acree steals second. Johnson reaches first on Stanley's error. Harrison flies out to pitcher. Duke retires the side on fly to Robertson.

N. C.—Honeycutt reaches first on Lockett's error and steals second. Kenan flies out to left. Stanley sacrifices Honeycutt to third. Graham follows with ground ball to short and is out at first. Score—Richmond College, 3; N. C., 0.

FIFTH INNING.—Lockett out on ground ball to Stephens. Phillips hits to Lanier and is thrown out at first. Duke, W., flies out to Graham.

N. C.—Stephens strikes out. Robertson out on ground ball to Phillips, who makes a difficult pick-up and a beautiful throw to first. Oldham, base on balls. Lanier gets to first on Duke's error. Oldham and Lanier each advanced a base on passed ball, and both score on Gregory's drive to right. Honeycutt strikes out. Score—Richmond, 3; N. C., 3.

SIXTH INNING.—Burnett reaches

first on Gregory's error. Ellyson hits to short-stop. Burnett and Ellyson both out on double play. Acree flies out to second.

N. C.—Kenan, base on balls. Stanley, base hit to right. Graham, E., bunts to pitch and Kenan is forced out at third, and Stanley scores on Stephens' two-base hit to right. Robertson, W., drives long fly to Duke in center, and is out. Graham, E., scores. Oldham hits to Duke, W., and is thrown out at first. Score—Richmond College, 3; N. C., 5.

SEVENTH INNING.—Johnston strikes out. Harrison, base on balls. Duke, F., flies out to Capt. Robertson. Lockett is thrown out on ground ball to Stanley.

N. C.—Lanier leads off with a single. Gregory, base on balls. Lanier and Gregory each advanced a base on passed ball. Honeycutt hits to pitcher and is out at first. Kenan follows with single to right, scoring Lanier. Kenan steals second. Stanley reaches first on error. Graham flies out to Duke, W. Score—Richmond College, 3; U. N. C., 6.

EIGHTH INNING.—Phillips flies to Honeycutt. Duke, W., hits pop foul to Oldham and is out. Burnett hits to Gregory and is out at first.

N. C.—Stephens leads off with a single, but is thrown out on attempt to steal second. Robertson, W., hits ground ball to second and is out at first. Oldham drives a three-bagger to left center. Lanier strikes out. Score—Richmond College, 3; U. N. C., 6.

NINTH INNING.—Richmond College fails to add anything to their score in this inning, Ellyson, Acree and Johnston each being thrown out at first on grounders to infield.
