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COLLEGE WORLD.

The University of Paris has over 7,000 students, yet it has no classes, no commencements, no college journals and no athletics.

Yale annually buys \$7,000 worth of books for her library. Harvard spends \$16,000 for the same purpose and Columbia \$43,000.

The attendance this year at the largest American Universities is as follows: Harvard has 3,350 students, Michigan 3,100, and Pennsylvania 2,900.

The Yale *Epitome*, a new periodical, has appeared. It is to be an annual and deals solely with college publications, aiming to reprint representative articles from each.

The University of Pennsylvania has quite an addition to its library in the way of a library of Italian literature containing three thousand volumes. This rare collection was bequeathed by the late Francis Macauley.

Michigan University has offered a six year combined Literary-Law course. The literary course contains a little law and considerable work in Economy and History, and the last two years are devoted to law exclusively.

A directory of lawyers who have graduated from Yale college has been copied and published by Francis Bergstrom, '88. Mr. Bergstrom is a member of the Minneapolis bar. The directory is arranged in alphabetical order by states, cities, and towns. The names are arranged in order of classes, the name of the oldest graduate in any place being first, etc. It contains 1,400 names, representing 40 states, 300 cities and towns, and six foreign countries. The purpose of the directory is to facilitate professional correspondence among Yale graduates.

The Ga. University, by a recent appropriation by the State Legislature, will receive \$14,000.

The *Clorleaf*, of the Kentucky University, devoted its last issue to the alumni of the University.

President Cleveland was so delighted with Princeton when he was in attendance at the sequicentennial that he will make his home there after his retirement from office. It is denied that he will have any connection with the recently established law school at Princeton.

According to the latest report of United States Commissioner of Education Harris, there are in this country 481 colleges and Universities. These enjoyed during the past year a total income of \$16,783,638, employed 8,459 instructors, and enrolled 63,402 under graduates and 4,273 graduate students.

The new library at Princeton will be one of the finest college buildings in the country. The architecture is after the pattern of the colleges of England, Gothic, and is the design of William A. Porter, of New York City. The building will cost about \$600,000, and will furnish shelves for 1,200,000 books, besides containing recitation rooms for those classes that require special library facilities.

President Twing's assertion that the college has greater influence on American life in training men than in promoting scholarship is a generalization hard either to prove or disprove. But it furnishes food for thought on the part of every college student. If true, it emphasizes the importance of making a college course not a mere absorption of book knowledge, but an all-around development in every possible line that a great university offers.—*Ex.*
