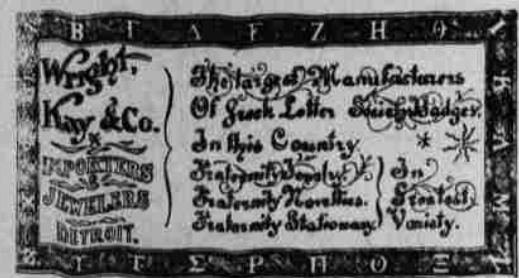
On Saturday at the residence of Mrs. Mollette, Mr. Samuel May, Instructor in Modern Languages, will entertain the Gingham and their lady friends.
