THE GUILFORD GAME.

for a touchdown. Then Belden kicked the goal. Time 2 minutes and 30 seconds.

Again the ball was placed in the centre of the field and Guilford's Full Back Captain Tomlinson kicked off for 35 yards. Belden returned kick for a gain of 38 and the ball came down the field in a great hustle-bustle of Guilford players, the career of which was cut short by Schull's breaking up some handsome interference and a pretty tackle by Belden. Then the ball went over on downs. Belden kicked in touch for 40 yards and the ball was given to the Varsity as Tomlinson put the ball in play with all of his men off side.

Again the Varsity rushed the ball along and through the undivided efforts of the eleven the ball was carried over the line again by McRae but Belden missed the goal. Time 9 minutes and 30 seconds.

Guilford's kick off was a beauty but it was totally eclipsed by Belden's return punt for 60 yards and a handsome bit of tackling by M'g'r Klutz. By quick runs around the ends and several creditable advances made by Turner and Simmons the ball was advanced to Guilford's 20 yard line where it went over on a fumble. Guilford played slow so as to kill time but finally the Varsity got the ball on downs and in Carolina style carried the ball to the four yard line. Here as usual the Varsity fumbled and the ball went over to Guilford, almost between their goal posts and only one minute and thirty seconds to play. On the first down they fumbled, Turner fell on the ball and crawled to the line for a touchdown. Belden kicked goal. Time 14 minutes.

In the last minute of the play the ball was kicked off forty yards by Guilford and by short but steady gains the Varsity carried the pig-

Manager Klutz was interviewed by a representative of the **TAR HEEL** the other morning in response to reported changes in the foot-ball schedule.

In regard to an inquiry as to whether or not the game with Georgia had been cancelled, Manager Klutz said:

"While arrangements for the game have not been definitely arranged, I am still corresponding with Georgia in regard to the matter. The probability is that the game will be played in Atlanta on Nov. 13th."

When asked about the Western game, of which there had been some little talk, Mr. Klutz said in substance that only one additional game had been contemplated by the management, and that with the University of Tennessee at Nashville; that it were barely possible that the game might be looked for either the 8th or 15th of November.

The dates were, however, somewhat inconvenient on account of the nearness to the Georgia and Virginia games.
