TAR HEELS DOWN TILMANITES.

2 yards but was tackled hard by White. Time called ball on Carolina 38 yard line.

Score Clemson 0. U. N. C. 24.

THE SECOND HALF.

Vogel kicked 25 yards and Shealy fell on the ball. Maxwell gained 2 around left end. Vogel went over Cromarti. for 2 and Hanvy made 1 more over Simmons. Gentry went around right end for 3 1/2 yards but Shealy failed to gain around the other end. Gentry also failed and the ball went over on downs.

Belden kicked for 40 yards net gain. Maxwell failed to walk over "Seat" Borland and Hanvy made only 1 over Simmons. Clemson began tricky ball playing and Vogel made 9 yards through centre on a double pass. Sullivan made 3 around left end and Maxwell on a long pass skirted Kluttz's end for 6 yards. Gentry gained only half a yard so Brock kicked for 25 Rogers returning 15 yards with the ball. Belden then punted beautifully for 55 yards, Clemson returning kick to Belden for 20—Carolina net gain 35 yards. Buxton walked through Simmons' opening for 3 and Collins through Bennett's for 5. Then in a series of rushes Buxton and Collins advanced the ball to the 10 yard line gaining 2 yards at a time. Buxton made 4 yards and Collins 4, placing the ball almost on the line. Belden failed to gain. Clemson off side. Collins over for touchdown. Belden missed easy goal. Time 8 minutes.

The remainder of the game was without features excepting the beautiful 15 yard run of Maxwell without interference and Beldens' long punt for 60 yards.

In the last few minutes Clemson's tricky ball chasers played snappy ball but in vain and with the ball on their 35 yard line time was called that they might catch the train. Score Clemson 0. U. N. C. 28.
