The Southern Inter-Collegiate Athletic Association has formulated a new set of rules to govern Football in the Colleges belonging to the Association. Some of the noticeable new rules and changes are the following:

After a goal has been kicked, the side against which the score was made, can have it's choice of kicking off or receiving the kick. This was for the benefit of weak teams.

Some changes were made in the number of points in scoring: goal from the field is 4, goal from place kick is 3, safety is 2, touchdown is 4, and goal from touchdown is 1.

There must be seven men on the line of scrimmage.

A player is to be put off the field for swearing or using vulgar language of any kind.

The Umpire, Referee and Linesmen are compelled to give testimony to each other of any violation of rules seen by any of them. The Linesmen, with two assistants, has charge of the five-yard string and he also keeps the time.
