Carolina opened on Virginia from her 40 yard line and by means of a few short gains through the line, a quarter back kick and one or two sprints by Howell terminating in that magnificent run for a touch down that won the game. With the guards back formation she steadily pushed Carolina back to her ten yard line when Carolina by a desperate stand stop. ped Virginia's errific rushes and saved the day. The ball was again kicked out of danger and once more Virginia started but was soon thrown back for such large losses that she tried a goal from field.
