"The Famous Victories" is a weak and insipid product, and Shakspeare cannot be called a plagarist for using it. It is dross; his play is pure gold. The incident of Hal,s taking the crown before his father's death is the same in the old play and in Henry V. The history found in the first act-the argument of the archbishop, the sending of the tennis balls, etc. are the same in both. In the old play there are but a few lines referring to Sir John Oldcastle, Shakespeare's immortal Falstaff. Oldcastle is a skeleton; Falstaff is a great original creation of flesh and blood.

"Reflections of Old English Life in Henry IV and V" was the title of on entertaining paper by Mr. A. A. Holmes, '01.
