on the Democratic ticket Oscar Underwood received from both students and faculty the largest number of ballots. The vote at the Y. M. C. A. was: Underwood 183; Harmon 79; Wilson 45; Clark 38; Bryan 2; Foss 1. On the Republican ticket as second choice for President Taft received 42 votes; Roosevelt 33; La Follette 17; Hughes 3. Debs did not receive a single vote as first choice. One man placed him as second choice on a ticket headed by Wilson. At the Bursar's office for second choice, Underwood

received 11; Harmon 7; Clark 2; Wilson 2; Roosevelt 5; Taft 1.

The striking things shown by the election were not Wilson's expected strength, but the fact, that Clark and La Follette received but 2 votes each of the 492 votes cast, not a one of which came from the faculty. The other unexpected thing revealed by the returns was that Roosevelt polled over twice as many votes as Taft for first choice. From the faculty Roosevelt received 2 votes to 1; from the students 55 to 20.

Every combination of names for first and second choice was made. The leading ticket was: Wilson, first; Underwood second. This varied on down to Wilson, Taft; and Wilson, Debs. Roosevelt, Taft was the favorite combination among the Republicans. The Insurgents in college showed themselves by voting for Roosevelt, Wilson; Roosevelt, La Follette. From this it will be seen that the favorite tickets were: a progressive and conservative; a straight progressive vote; a conservative-progressive; and a straight-conservative.

The total ballot is given below. The total vote each candidate received for first place and the different combination in which he figured are shown.

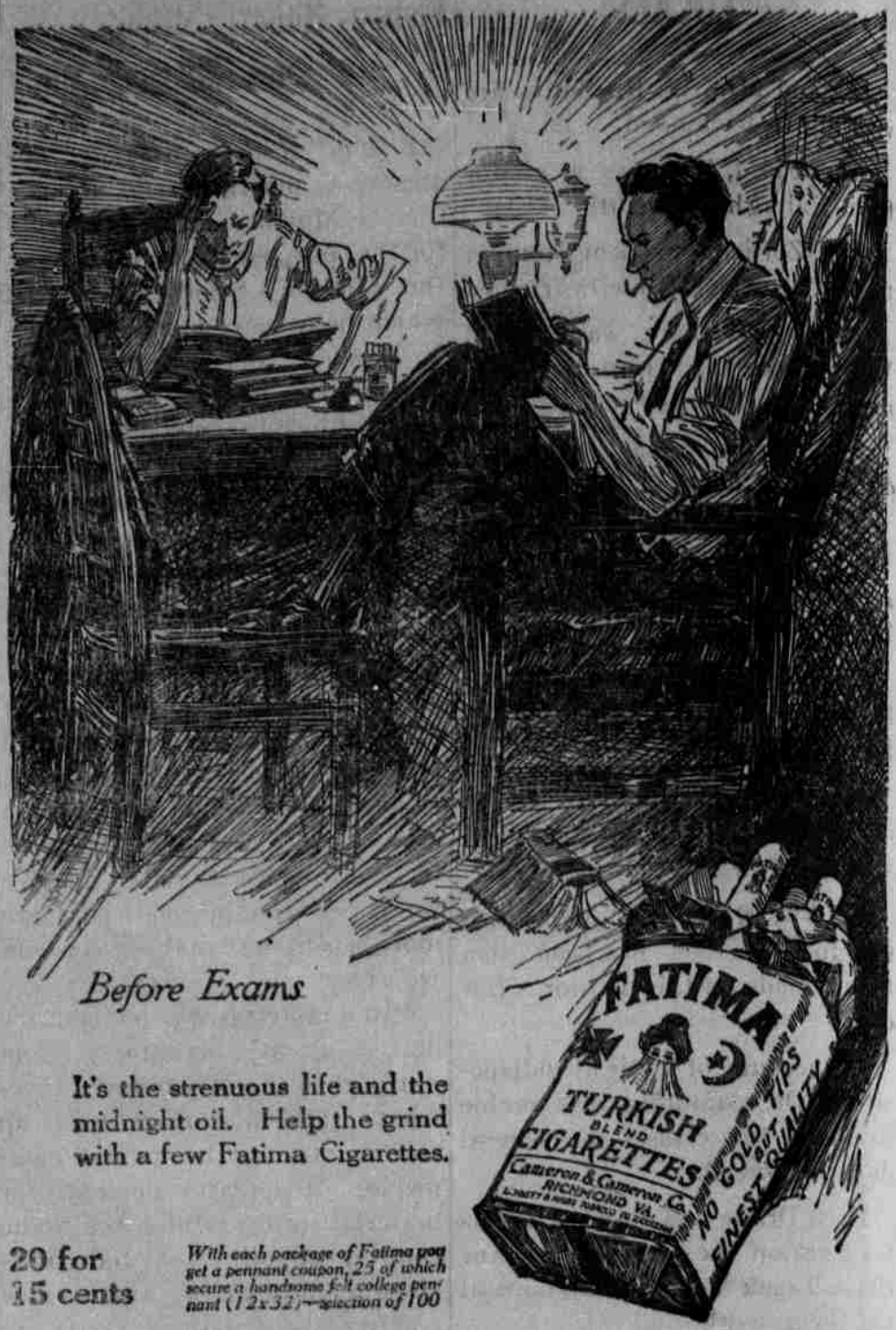

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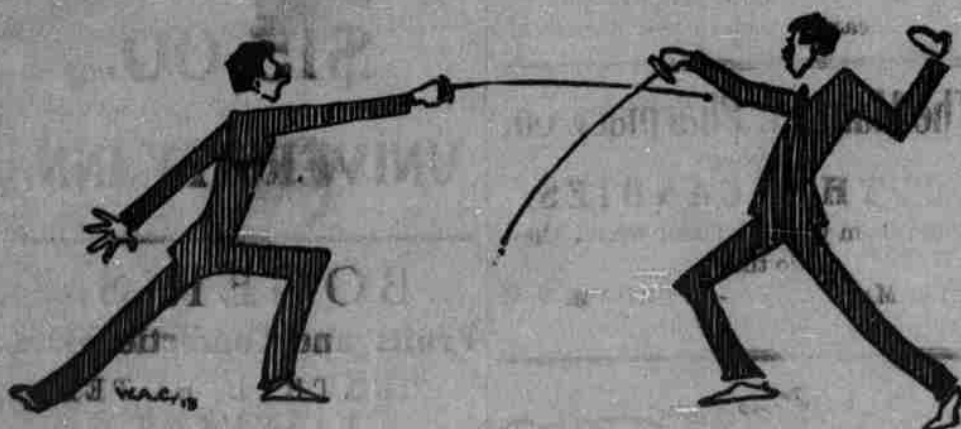
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
