A. was: Underwood 183; Harmon 79; Wilson 45; Clark 38; Bryan 2; Foss 1. On the Republican ticket as second choice for President Taft re ceived 42 votes. Ronselt 33, ceived 42 votes; Roosevelt 33 ; La
Follette 17 ; Hughes 3 Debs did not receive a single vote as first choice. One man placed him as second choice on a ticket headed by Wilson. At the Bursar's office for second choice, Underwoo
received 11; Harmon 7; Clark 2; Wilson 2; Roosevelt 5; Taft 1. The striking things shown by the election were not Wilson's expected strength, but the fact, that but 2 votes each of the 492 votes but 2 votes each of the 492 votes cast, not a one of which came
