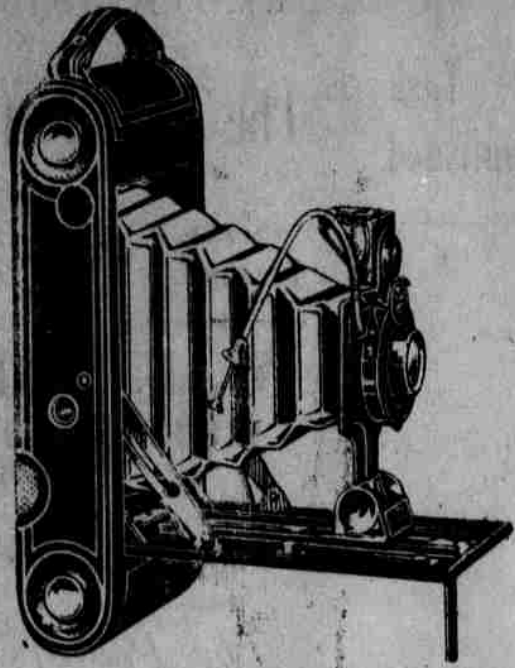


Let KODAK Solve the Christmas Problem



SHAW'S ARMS AND THE MAN CLASS TENNIS MATCHES

The Modern and Fascinating Comedy Will be Presented December 4.

"Arms and the Man" will be presented in Gerrard Hall Friday December 4th, without Bernard Shaw.

When "Pygmalion", Shaw's newest comedy was to be presented for the first time this fall in the New Theatre, the management wired Mr. Shaw to come over to New York for the first performance. Shaw in the cablegram in answer made the characteristic reply that "as America had waited so long for a visit from him that he could not now risk it because Americans might be disappointed in him after he came."

The management of "Arms and the Man", which is to be presented here by the University Dramatic Association, wanted to get Mr. Shaw for the first performance at Chapel Hill December 4th, but it regrets that Mr. Shaw cannot leave England.

However, the star cast of the Dramatic Club will present "Arms and the Man" regardless. The cast now consists of four N. C. Dramatic men, Coggin, Johnson, Weeks, and Kerr who will be great factors in the production of this clever and fascinating little comedy.

A change was recently effected in the cast in substituting Kerr for Meredith in Catherine's part, and in Meredith's taking the leading lady's part, Raina.

It is of interest to note that the Dramatic Club is putting on a modern comedy, and one in which the people of North Carolina will be interested.

Representative Teams From Eastern and Western Parts of State Meet Here

The teams in the Western part have not yet come to an agreement as to their schedule but representatives from each school will meet in Charlotte on the 25th to arrange one.

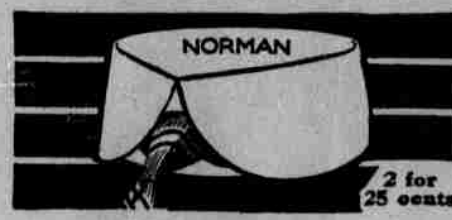
