 "And he was upstairs," said Dr. Moss. "That is the spirit that most teachers should believe in. And that is the spirit that will mean much for future generations of children in North Carolina."

For the interests of our people it is imperative that we bring our State University to the full equal of Harvard, Yale, the University of Michigan or the University of Wisconsin, and our State Agricultural and Mechanical College to be the equal of the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, the Columbia School of Mines, or the Massachusetts School of Technology.
