TAG FOOTBALL RULES FOR YEAR ANNOUNCED

Tag football will be played this fall according to the inter-collegiste football rules with the following exceptions:

1. The man with the ball has only to be tagged or touched, instead of tackled. 2. Every man on the team is eligible to receive a forward pass.

3. Only one lateral pass may be made during one play, that is from the beginning of a play until its completion.

4. Two twenty (20) minute halves, with no time out, unless some one is hurt, with five minutes between the halves, will constitute a game.


5. In case of a tie game, the team making the most number of first downs receives one extra point and thereby becomes winner.


6. Spiked shoes cannot be used. **Special Notice**
