Governor Harry Flood Byrd, of Virginia, and Governor Angus W. McLean, of North Carolina, have accepted invitations to be guests of honor at the Virginia-Carolina football game to be played on Lambeth Field Thanksgiving Day, D. Brown, Graduate Manager, has announced.

This is to be the 33rd game between the Cavaliers and Tar Heels within the 35-year period since the initial gridiron contest between them in 1893. Twenty of the games have been won by Virginia, nine by North Carolina, and three years have been tied. The Kenan stadium was dedicated in Chapel Hill last Fall with a 14 to 13 victory for the Carolinians.

Accommodations are being planned on Lambeth Field for the largest crowd that has ever seen a football game in the Old Dominion. Bleachers are being constructed to take care of the overflow from the concrete stadium.
