Bill Albans Takes Fourth With22Total

Battling Bill Albans, taking individual high-scoring honors with 22 points, led North Carolina to fourth place in the NCAA Track Championships at Minneapolis on Saturday. The Tar Heel's favorite swept three places which included a first in the 220 yard hurdles, third in the broad-jump, and third in the 120 yard high hurdles.

In the trials on Friday, both Albans and Bill Kirk qualified in their events with the former scoring first in the low hurdles and the broad jump. Kirk qualified fourth in the preliminaries in the javelin but slipped to a poor seventh in the finals.

The course on the hurdles seemed a relatively new one for Albans as they were held on the curve around the track. In regular dual competition in the Southern Conference, the hurdles are run on a straight course.

His time in the 220 lows was 23.8 which was nine tenths of a Recreational Children: second above his best time.
