UNC Journalism Graduate Gets Newspaper Award

WINSTON-SALEM—Alfred G. (Pete) Ivey, a 1934 graduate of the University of North Carolina, is one of the 12 American newspapermen to win a Lucius W. Nieman Fellowship.

The fellowships are awarded annually by Harvard University where Ivey will study for one year, beginning in September.

Ivey is associate editor of the Winston-Salem Journal and Sentinel. His fellowship award established a new record. It marked the first time in the 14-year history of the awards that two members of the same paper have won Nieman Fellowships in successive years. Journal and Sentinel Reporter Hoké Norris, a Wake Forest graduate, was awarded one of the fellowships last summer and has recently completed his one-year of study at Harvard.

Ivey, a 38-year-old Rocky Mount native, majored in journalism at Carolina and was editor of the Buccaneer humor mag during his senior year. He also lettered in boxing and was a member of the Order of the Golden Fleece.

Following his graduation in 1934, Ivey remained at the University for two years as director of the Graham Memorial Student Union. He came to Winston-Salem as a reporter in 1938, and shortly thereafter established a daily column, "Pass the Peanuts."

He entered the Army in 1942 and rose through the ranks from private to captain. Out of the army in 1946, he assisted General Omar Bradley with the establishment of the Veteran's Administration. Ivey's job was to organize newspapers in 125 veterans

hospitals throughout the country.

He returned to active newspapering in 1948 as associate editor of the Journal and Sentinel. Every year since that time his editorials have won awards in the annual North Carolina Press Association competition.

Ivey is married and has two children, ages five and two. His wife is also a UNC graduate. She will accompany him to Harvard and plans to do graduate work with her husband during the next school year.
