"It is the duty of everyone to seek to understand the ideas and ideals involved in this conflict, for this is the only way in which truth and freedom can triumph," he said. "Public school teachers are in a position to stimulate and lead the thinking not only of their pupils but of their entire communities. The workshop is designed as an aid to selected teachers in their attempts to promote discussion and understanding in their school communities of the fundamental issues in the idealogical struggle between democracy and communism."
