

UNC Religion Department Praised By Columbia Man

North Carolina's program of religious instruction in the public schools, and particularly the University's department of religion, was described as one of the bright spots in the nation in reaching constructive solutions to the problem of secularization in education by Dr. James A. Pike, chaplain and head of the department of religion of Columbia University.

Speaking to an audience in Gerrard Hall this week, Pike also sharply criticized the U. S. Supreme Court's decision in the McCollum versus Champaign School District, which barred released-time religious education conducted in the classrooms.

"If the Supreme Court presumed to lay a hand on the fine programs permitted in this State," he said, "you would have a serious

problem of conscience as to whether your loyalty to the Constitution, as thus misinterpreted, would override your loyalty to your religion—which is the only force which, in the long run, can sustain the democracy on which the Supreme Court itself depends."

In closing he again praised the "fine Department of Religion" here. His appearance was sponsored by the University YMCA.

Curve Inn Defies Town

Construction work continued this week on alternatives of the highly-controversial Curve Inn on the Durham road in defiance of a stop-work order by the Town of Chapel Hill.

The Board of Aldermen on Monday night ordered Buildings Inspector P. L. Burch to revoke the building permit for alterations on the Strowd Hill drive-in beer and short-order eatery after a delegation of 15 citizens from the thickly-populated residential area demanded that the establishment, extremely popular with Carolina students, be put out of business as a public nuisance.

An attorney for the establishment's owner, Dr. S. A. Nathan, declared his client had no intention of stopping work on the building, alterations on which are now about 90 per cent complete. He indicated a court suit over the affair might be in the offing. Town officials withheld comment on the matter when contacted by The Tar Heel, as did Dr. Nathan.

For the past several months the Curve Inn has been subjected to attempts to force it to close its doors by town, officials and residents of the area, who describe it as a "public nuisance."
