Frozen Fruit Slices

Broadcast: July 28, 1951

3-oz. pkg. white cream cheese 1 1/2 cups drained fruit cocktail
1/4 cup salad dressing* 1/2 cup ice cold Pet Milk
1/4 teaspoon salt 2 teaspoons lemon juice

Put cream cheese into bowl. Stir in salad dressing and salt; mix until smooth. Add fruit cocktail and mix well. Whip chilled milk with cold rotary beater until fluffy. Add lemon juice; whip until stiff. Fold into fruit mixture. Freeze, without stirring, in automatic refrigerator tray at coldest temperature, or in a mold buried in mixture of 3 parts crushed ice to 1 part ice cream salt. Slice and serve as dessert or salad. Makes 4 servings.

* Use the kind that comes in a jar, not a bottle.

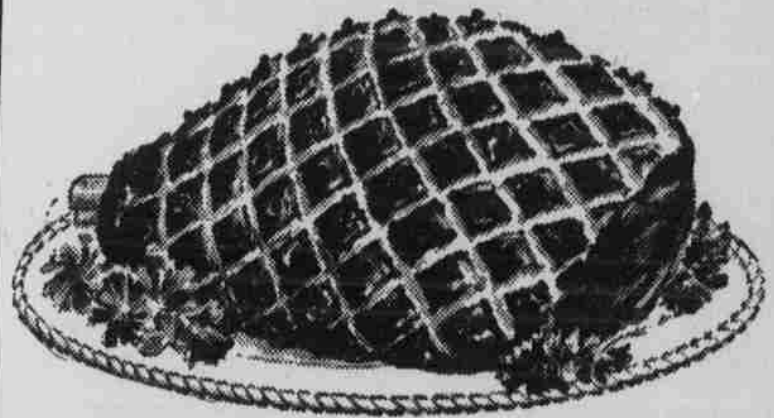
