

Intramural Activities Open

The scheduled intramural activities of tennis, golf, and softball are now open to all students, George McGinty, assistant intramural manager announced yesterday.

Entries for the tennis tournaments can sign up at the tennis courts or at the intramural office in Woollen Gym. Deadline for entries is June 18. Play begins Tuesday, June 22 with single eliminations. Later matches will be based on winning 2 out of 3 sets, and the semi-finals and finals will be played 3 out of 5 sets. Before the first match each entry must furnish one can of tennis balls, and these will be used throughout the tournaments, the winner of each match keeping the new can of balls, thus each match will always be played with new balls.
