Free Film Series

Graham Memorial's free summer film series starts tonight with the showing of "The Unholy Three," at 8:30 p.m. in Carroll Hall.

"The Unholy Three," a silent film classic made in 1925, stars Lon Chaney, Mae Busch and Victor McLaglen. The story is a crime melodrama with Chaney masquerading as an old woman. It is famous for Chaney's mastery of horror and horrific make-up.

Other free films appearing on the series this session are: July 1, "The Barber of Seville" (a French Opera Comique production of Rossini's famous opera); July 8, six American comedies titled, "The Doctor's Secret," "Gertie the Dinosaur," "His Bitter Pill" (a Mack Sennett silent), "The Sex Life of the Polyp" (with Robert Benchley), and "The Skeleton Dance" (by Walt Disney).

Mathematics Conference

The conference on Collegiate Mathematics, designed to assist colleges and universities in improving undergraduate training in mathematics, got under way here Tuesday, June 15 and will continue till Friday, August 6.

Two internationally distinguished mathematicians, Prof. Emil Artin of Princeton University and Prof. Tibor Rado of Ohio State University, are the principal lecturers. Each will conduct a series of lectures extending through the entire conference. Professor Artin will speak on "Selected Topics in Modern Algebra," and Professor Rado's subject will be "The Mathematical Theory of Rigid Surfaces: An Application of Modern Analysis."

Other speakers who will be present for periods of the conference include Prof. F. L. Griffin, Reed College, Portland, Oregon; Prof. R. M. Thrall, University of Michigan; and Prof. A. W. Tucker, Princeton.

The program, directed by Prof. Edward A. Cameron of the University, is being sponsored and financed by the National Science Foundation.
