

## 2¼ Million Will Be Expended On Buildings and Campus Activities List

More than 2¼ million dollars will be spent by the University for two new buildings, renovations and grounds improvement, J. S. Bennett, director of operations stated yesterday.

Construction of a million dollar Institute of Government building will begin around Sept. 1. It will be located on the Raleigh road beside the Institute of Government barracks. One-half the funds has been provided by the Knapp Foundation and the state will provide the other half. The design will be in keeping with the other buildings on the campus, and includes office, administrative and classroom space.

A million dollar art building, to be called the Aekland Art Museum, after William H. Aekland who donated the land for the building, is scheduled for construction this fall. It will be located on Columbia street across from the Baptist church and will occupy the Anchor House site and the lot north of it. Work on the final design is not yet complete.

Sanitary improvements now under way will cost the University \$199,000. The upper and lower quadrangle will receive new, rubber tile floors, and the bathrooms of the

lower quad dorms will be improved. Completely new bathrooms are being installed in Old West, Old East, Steele, Battle, Vance, and Pettigrew dorms, and Cobb will be furnished with a social room.

The University has received a gift of \$50,000 from John Motley Morehead, donor of the Planetarium, for the construction of a sun dial and surrounding garden area on the island of the Planetarium parking lot.

Progress of formal landscaping continues on the campus. The old well will soon be replaced by a completely new one, with the exception that the columns of the old well will be retained. New features will be a granite base and a copper roof. The cost of this project has not yet been released.

Brick sidewalks on the north section of the campus bordering Franklin street will soon completely replace the old sand and gravel walks which once helped lend to the informal, friendly character of the Carolina campus, but which, however, proved inadequate in wet weather.

Graham Memorial will soon have new steps built onto the north end of the building, and flowers and shrubs will be planted in the area.

## Queens' Grad Wins Award

Miss Patsy Jean Harmon, Charlotte, has been awarded a \$150 scholarship offered by the French Government to a student enrolled in the French Workshop now being held at the University of North Carolina.

Dr. Jacques Hardre of the UNC Department of Romance Languages and Workshop director, announced Miss Harmon's selection for the award.

The Workshop, replacing the summer French House program, is designed especially for French teachers and prospective teachers to refresh or perfect their knowledge of the French language.

Dr. Hardre explained that the Workshop's 14 students, most of whom are high school teachers, will receive special aid on their problems in the teaching of French.

A 1951 graduate of Queens College, where she majored in French, Miss Harmon plans to begin teaching French in secondary schools this fall.

As an undergraduate she was a member of Sigma Mu, honorary scholarship society, and Alpha Kappa Gamma, honorary leadership society. She is listed in the 1953-54 "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities."

In connection with the Workshop, the Cultural Services of the French Embassy have sent a collection of 24 newly-published French books to the Department of Romance Languages.

These books, which include textbooks on French grammar, civilization, dictionaries, lists of audio-visual aids and records, are on exhibit through June 20 in Murphey Hall, Room 212, Dr. Hardre said.
