forces on Formosa so that they can work for the overthrow of the Communist regime.

But Dr. Cheng is familiar not only with the Orient, but also with western countries. He and his wife have just returned from an extensive tour of seven European countries.

He is presently on leave from his position as associate professor at the University of Hawaii. Prior to teaching there, he was assistant professor and member of the Research Society at the University of Washington, where he had received his Ph.D. in sociology and political science.

When asked how the University of Hawaii differs from UNC, Dr. Cheng replied that the two were very similar, except that more graduate work is offered here while in Hawaii more emphasis is placed on undergraduate studies. There is one other difference, however, and this is enough to make many Chapel Hillians turn longingly to travel folders—the temperature in Hawaii usually stays from 58 to 86 degrees all year round.

Dr. Cheng strongly favors statehood for Hawaii, because it has progressed as much as most states. Its culture may be a little different, but cultures in various states also differ from one another. For instance, life in New England is quite different from that in the Southwest. He has recently written a paper to Congress on the progress of Hawaii. He believes statehood will be granted Hawaii soon; it is just a matter of time.

Three faculty members have been granted leaves of absence, Chancellor R. B. House announced, following approval by President Gray and the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

John T. O'Neil, associate professor of finance, was granted a leave of absence from July 1, 1954 through June 30, 1955 to work with the Scott Paper Company of Chester, Pennsylvania. He was awarded a fellowship established by that company.

Paul N. Guthrie, professor of economics, will be on leave for the fall semester, 1954-55, "to undertake responsible work with some of the large companies of the country."

John P. Gillin, professor in the Department of Sociology and Anthropology, was granted a one-year leave from September 1, 1954 to August 31, 1955 for study and research on the West Coast under a Ford Foundation grant.
