The Wrong Box—August 1—Hilarious comedy starring Michael Caine, Peter Sellers, and Sir Ralph Richardson.

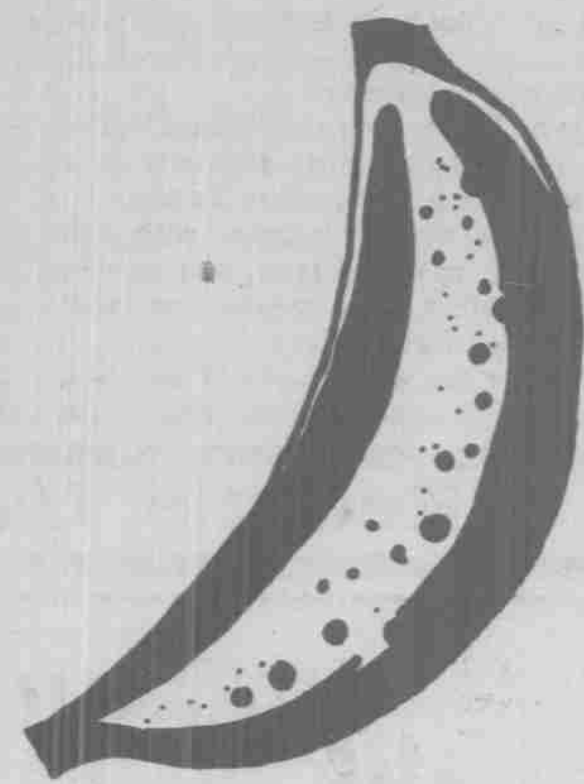
What Banana?
