## Taster's Choice

"Chinatown"—Straightforward storytelling which doesn't kid its hero or its subject makes this Roman Polanski film one of the best of the year. A sense of amoral doom—Chinatown—permeates everything. (At the Carolina, through Tuesday.)

"For Pete's Sake"—A new Barbra Streisand comedy with an absurd plot about pork bellies, written by the authors of "Pillow Talk." Varies recommends it only for "diehard fans." (At Plaza 3.)

"The Last Picture Show"—A good film about a dying Texas town in the 1950's. Ben Johnson and Cloris Leachman won Oscars; Peter Bogdanovich won Cybill Shepherd. (At Plaza 2.)

"The Learning Tree"—Photographer Gordon Parks directed his first film very much in the style of his Life Magazine spreads: poetic sensitivity and fine composition. Dramatically, it's weaker, but better than "Shaft," which he did next. Being black and poor in the Depression Midwest. (Union free flick, Tuesday.)

"The Little Foxes"—Bette Davis is evil Regins Hubbard in Lillian Hellman's story of a rotting Southern dynasty. Davis, Herbert Marshall and Dan Duryea are excellent, and the William Wyler film has class. (Duke, Cross Chemistry Auditorium, Wednesday at 8.)

"The Nine Lives of Fritz the Cat"—An animated sequel to a humorous cartoon about us in the Sixties. This Fritz, however, has a different director and rides mainly on its predecessor's reputation. (At the Varsity, starting Sunday.)

"Pope le Moko"—A romantic, fatalistic gangster film called the peak of director Julien Duvivier's style. The 1937 French film stars Jean Gabin, who is alone in Algiers. (Union free flick, Sunday.)

"Pippi in the South Seas"—Pippi Longstocking's contemporaries (age 8) won't notice the obvious dubbing and jerky editing in this Swedish-West German import, says Variety. But we will, so skip it. (At Plaza 1.)

"Reeler Madness"—Marijuana hysteria in the '30s produced this "documentary" warning that pot leads to rape, murder and other things. Sheer camp now, but it's depressing to think it was filmed seriously. (At the Carolina, late show, tonight and Saturday.)

"The Sugarland Express"—A romantic melodrama stars Goldie Hawn as a Texas mother who wants to get Baby back from the welfare people. Steven Spielberg, who directed Duel on television, films his first movie with action and style, according to most critics. (At the Carolina, starts Wednesday.)

"The Three Musketeers"—Raquel Welch

and pratfalls. (At the Varsity, through Saturday.)

"Up to His Ears"—Jean-Paul Belmondo chases Ursula Andress through Hong Kong. Directed by Phillippe de Broca, who did "King of Hearts." (Duke, Biological Sciences Auditorium, Friday at 8.)

"The Wrong Box"—An Edwardian farce about coffins and corpses, with Michael Caine and some funny Britishers. (Union free flick, Thursday.)

Today is the 21st anniversary of the attack on the Moncada barracks in Cuba led by Fidel Castro. This day is celebrated in communist countries around the world as Cuba's Independence Day.

This year the emphasis during the worldwide celebration is on the Chilean condition since last year's coup. The day is being celebrated in 13 U.S. cities, and as part of the celebration, the Venceramos Brigade of North Carolina was in Chapel Hill Wednesday night.

A photo exhibition in the Union showed

the destruction of Chile's culture since the coup. The walls of the cities were painted with murals prior to the military take-over. All the walls have since been whitewashed.

The film *Chile with Poems and Guns* was also presented. This is the first documentary about Chile since the coup. The film was produced by Charles Horman, a U.S. citizen. After the coup, he was denied asylum by the U.S. Embassy. He was shot and killed two weeks after finishing the film.

Chile was the second country in the western hemisphere to have a Marxist government, and it was the first country in the world to have a freely elected Marxist president.

Last September 11th, the Chilean military reacted to the economic chaos that was developing, and in the ensuing violence, President Salvador Allende died.

After the coup, Santiago was the scene of a bloodbath of unknown proportions. Estimates range from 3,000 to 15,000 people killed in the capital city alone.

In 1970 it was reported that free political discussion was an important part of Chilean life. In business, social and family environments, politics and religion were freely and openly discussed. Now, even the words "comrade" and "worker" are banned, and the citizens seem to take risks talking about the weather.
