Distinguished men to instruct in the Law school this summer include Wil-

lard J. Graham, of the University of Chicago; Harry Shulman, of Yale university and Edson R. Sunderland, of the University of Michigan.

A special feature of the Law summer school will be a course in North Carolina practice. Donald W. Markham of the regular law faculty will be assisted in teaching this course by four prominent state attorneys and a member of the Superior Court bench: H. G. Hudson, Winston-Salem; Kenneth Royall, Raleigh; Charles W. Tillett, Charlotte; Frank E. Winslow, Rocky Mount; and Judge J. Will Pless, Marion.

Med School

The Biochemistry department of the Medical school will offer a course on food chemistry in accordance with a plan for developing an active program of teaching and research on foods and the principles of dietetics.

Heretofore, it has not been the practice of the Medical school to offer summer courses, but plans are underway for offering an increasing amount of summer work. Although the course on food chemistry is the only one scheduled thus far, other courses in fields related to medicine but designed for non-medical students will be added in the future.

The Geology department will offer a course in practical field work in the southern part of the Appalachian mountains during the first session. Areas to be studied include the central Appalachian area in West Virginia, Virginia and North Carolina.

Visiting instructors in the School of Library Science this summer will include Miss Frieda M. Heller, Librarian of Ohio State Library school; Guy R. Lyle, Librarian of the Woman's college, Mrs. Catharine J. Pierce, reference librarian of Swarthmore college; Miss Beatrice Howard Holt, assistant professor in the University of Denver School of Librarianship; and Miss Muriel S. Jordan, of the Children's Library of Durham.

The Art department will offer courses for elementary school teachers, who which to obtain a working knowledge of rudimentary technique, history and appreciation of art, architecture and sculpture; laboratory technique, and the teaching of industrial and practical arts. Prof. Robert M. Skelton of the Woman's college will conduct several classes as visiting instructor.

Visiting professor in the Zoology department this summer will be Dr. J. Paul Reynolds, of Birmingham.
