
The Jayvees have won six games thus far, in the season while losing one. Their six wins include two thrillers over the Duke JV five.

The Carolina White Phantoms attempt to hurdle the first of two tough obstacles slated for this weekend tonight, meeting the University of Maryland in College Park at 8 o'clock. The Tar Heels defeated the Old Liners decisively here a few weeks ago, but the Maryland five has since knocked off Duke's high-flying Blue Devils.

After the skirmish tonight, the Phants will move on to Annapolis, where they are scheduled to tangle with unbeaten Navy tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. The Navy tilt combined with the Maryland encounter constitutes probably Carolina's hardest weekend since they took on NYU and St. Joseph during Christmas, for both these clubs were victorious against Duke two weeks ago.


