

Taylor Lauds Shakespeare

Gives New Slant On Writer's Value

Emphasizing that Shakespeare had the happy faculty of being able to see the other fellow's side, Dr. George Coffin Taylor, widely known authority on the dramatist and a Kenan professor of English in the University of North Carolina, said in an address here last night that it is his hope that "Shakespeare's quality of mind will help our quality of mind if we expect to avoid another war."

"While the war was on it was necessary for us to assume that all the virtues of mankind were monopolized by America and her Allies", he declared. "Now that the war is over the continuation of that self-certainty and Pharisaism on our part makes about the best approach to bringing on another war that I can conceive of."

Dr. Taylor's address, entitled "Shakespeare, Thinker", was the third in the current series of lectures being sponsored by the Humanities Division of the University. Previous ones were delivered by Dr. W. M. Dey on French poetry and by Dr. J. P. Harland on Greek archeological exploration.

In addition, he plays first trumpet with Roy Cole's Orchestra, popular dance band.

The program will include a varied selection of classical and modern music and will be announced by Rex Coston, senior music student.
