Carolina's inability to hit in the clutches cost the Tar Heels another ball game yesterday as NC State's Big Four leaders marked up a 4-1 triumph behind the eight-hit hurling of hefty Curt Ramsey on Emerson field.

Carolina will meet Davidson at Davidson today in a conference game.

The Tar Heels left 10 runners stranded in the course of the contest as the Wolfpack made their eight hits count for four runs against Monk Whiteheart. The visitors tallied once in each of the first three innings and scored again in the fifth.

Carolina's lone score came in the second frame when John Gregory drilled a triple into the left-field corner and came home on the first of three singles by Harry Beason.

Opening Score

The State nine opened the game by scoring one run when Josh Newborn slashed a single to right, went to second while Whiteheart was throwing out Jim Edwards, and came home on PeeWee Gardner's line single to center.

Bob Courts opened the second frame for Coach Vic Sorrell's club by driving a long flyball double to center. Whiteheart bore down to get Stanton and Kohler on third strikes, but Ramsey socked a safety over second to bat in the second run.

Fifth Inning

The fifth inning, in which State scored the final run of the game, was quite involved. Edwards drew a walk to start the inning and went to second on Gardner's single off Hearn's glove. Wilson was safe at first on a fielder's choice and when Ryan had the ball jarred out of his glove at second, everyone was safe and Edwards scored.

Wilson was then hit by a batted ball, and when Ryan picked up the ball and threw to first ahead of Courts, the umpires first called everybody safe and then changed the decision, calling it a double play.

The locals kept pecking away at Ramsey, getting at least one hit in all but three innings and leaving at least one man on base every inning. However, State's 215-pound tosser was able to quell every Tar Heel threat. Beason, with three singles, and Gregory with a triple and single, led the Carolina batsmen.

A repeat of their previous 9-0 whitewash performance over the army team would also give the Tar Heels their fifth consecutive shutout and eighth of the season.

Harold Maass, victorious in a tough, three-set encounter Saturday against Virginia's ace netter, Harold Burrows, after having dropped a decision to the Cavalier in April, will occupy his usual top position against the soldiers. Sam Daniels will hold down the second berth and Stan Gruner will shoot for his 12th triumph of the campaign in the third pairing. Jim Nicholson at number four, Don Skakle, unbeaten in seven clashes, and Dick Swigart complete the singles starters.

Change in Doubles

One change will be made in the doubles lineup, due to the departure of Mel Jordan. The two top combinations of Maass and Gruner, and Nicholson and Skakle have become fixtures, and Daniels and Duke Wilder will form the third duo.

After today's tilt, three more matches will remain on the Carolina slate. The Tar Heels oppose Duke May 11, Wake Forest May 14, and State May 15. All three crews have already been trounced by 9-0 scores.

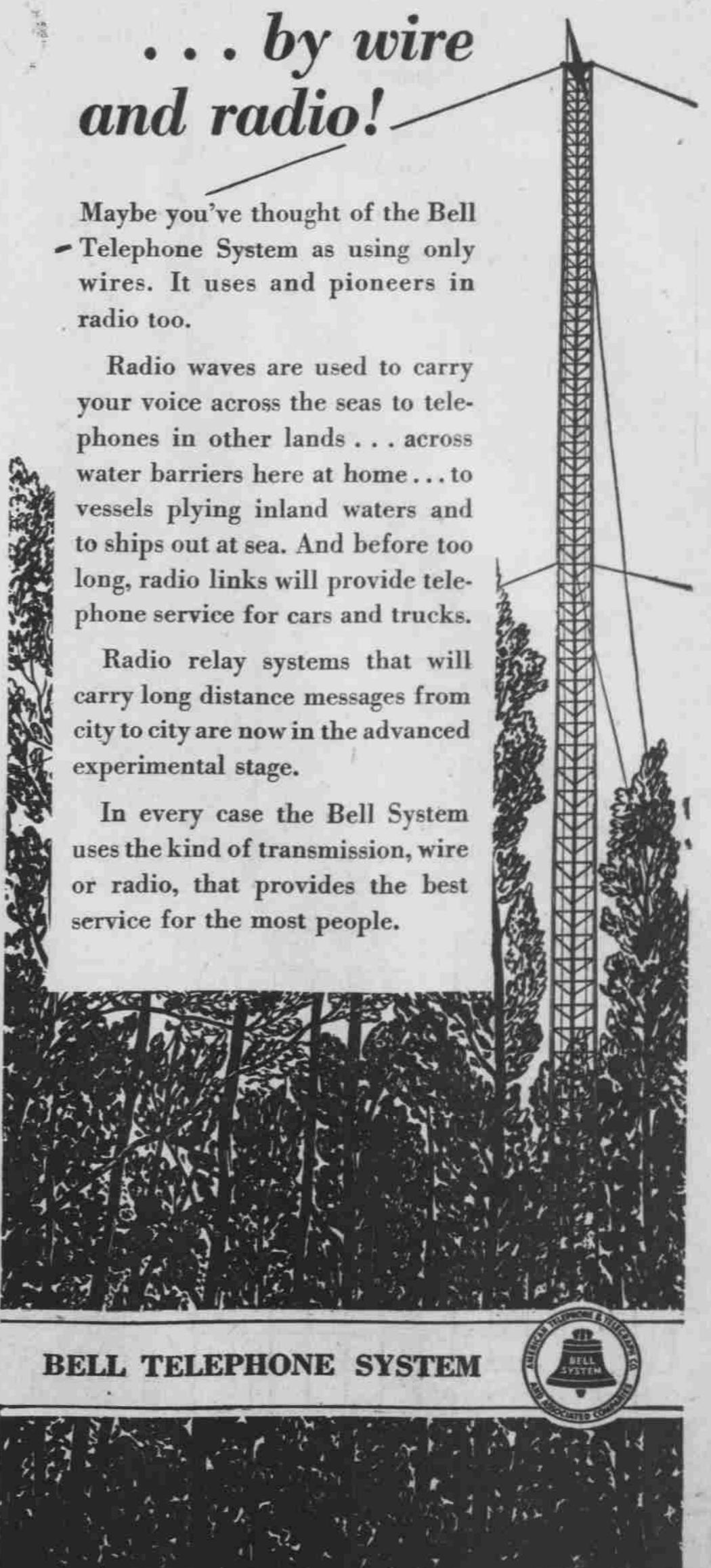
