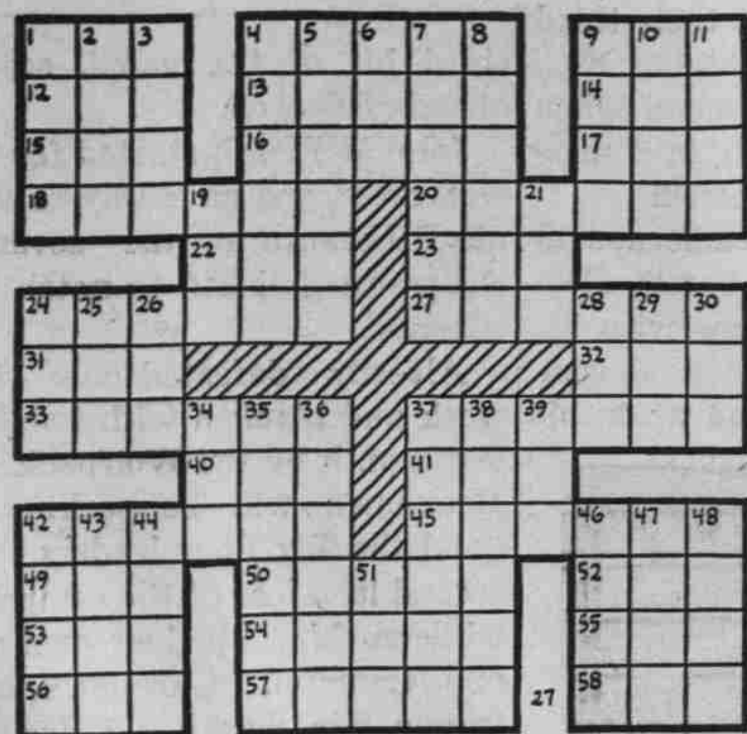

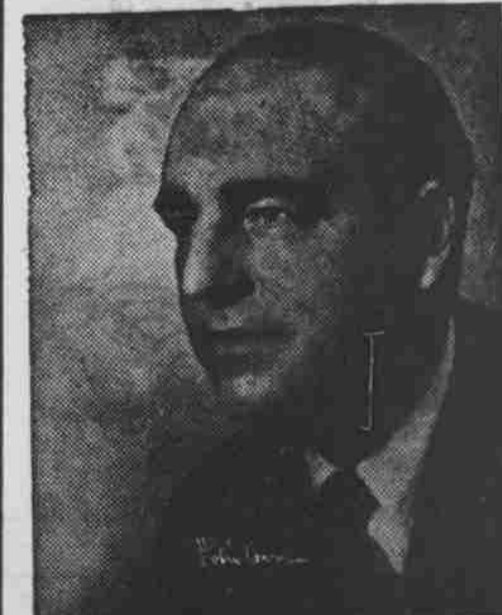

of \$50 for each offense or violation."

Since the order carried a mandatory fine of \$50, the court could not alter the amount. After the case was discussed, Judge Henry Whitfield said that he realized the fine was "stiff". After holding the case open, the court found there was no lawful way to reduce the fine and the case was closed.

Weaver Hit Court

Weaver said in his letter: "How can a Kangaroo Court—a high sounding name for such a degenerated Recorder's Court as we have here—legally show discrimination among the people who serve the inmates under its jurisprudence?"

Editor Morrison made the following statement concerning the letter: "Whether Weaver is right or wrong in his accusations I am totally unaware, but that he has the right to speak and write for all to hear and read I can not deny.
