US-Russian Talks In Korea Bugged

Seoul, Korea, May 8—American army headquarters says the United States-Soviet Joint Commission set up to form a government for Korea will be unable to continue its discussions. Headquarters says the commission discussions have broken down because Soviet delegates refuse to consult with Korean leaders who are opposed to the allied trusteeship plan.

Br. Loan Amendment Rejected by Senate

Washington, May 8—The Senate has rejected an amendment to the loan to Britain which called for outright United States possession of Atlantic bases now leased from England. The vote on the so-called McFarland amendment was 45 to 40.

Washington, May 8—A technical point intended to throw the proposed three and three quarter billion dollar British loan out of the Senate was raised today. Senator Edwin Johnson, of Colorado, argued that the loan authorization bill is a revenue-raising measure, and therefore should originate in the House of Representatives under the terms of the constitution. The Senate has agreed to vote on the Johnson challenge tomorrow.
