

Airport Welcomes Inaugural Flight Of Daily Schedule

The inaugural flight of Southeast Airlines' twice daily schedule was welcomed at the Horace Williams' airport yesterday morning.

Chapel Hill is now included on the new air service schedule with 20 other North Carolina cities, ranging from Asheville and Hendersonville in the mountains to Wilmington, New Bern, Washington, Elizabeth City and Morehead City on the coast.

Flying west from here at 9:04 o'clock every morning, the Cessna is due in Asheville at 11:12 a.m.; and going east from Chapel Hill at 5:08 o'clock in the afternoon arrives in Morehead City at 7:12 p.m.

As soon as the number of passengers warrant increased stops here, the 27-passenger Douglas DC-3 will stop at Chapel Hill on its run between Charlotte and Wilmington. For information, call 8211.

Student Legislature Senate in 1944; president Tau Kappa Alpha, national debate fraternity 1945-46; chairman Carolina Political Union 1945-46; member IRC 1944-45; member of Student Welfare Board 1943-44-45-46; Graham Memorial Board of Directors 1944-45; an editorial columnist for the Tar Heel in 1943-44-45; Amphoterothen 1945-46; member of Golden Fleece 1945-46.

Crisp was the first student to receive the John J. Parker, Jr., gold medal for student government leadership in his junior year, 1945. 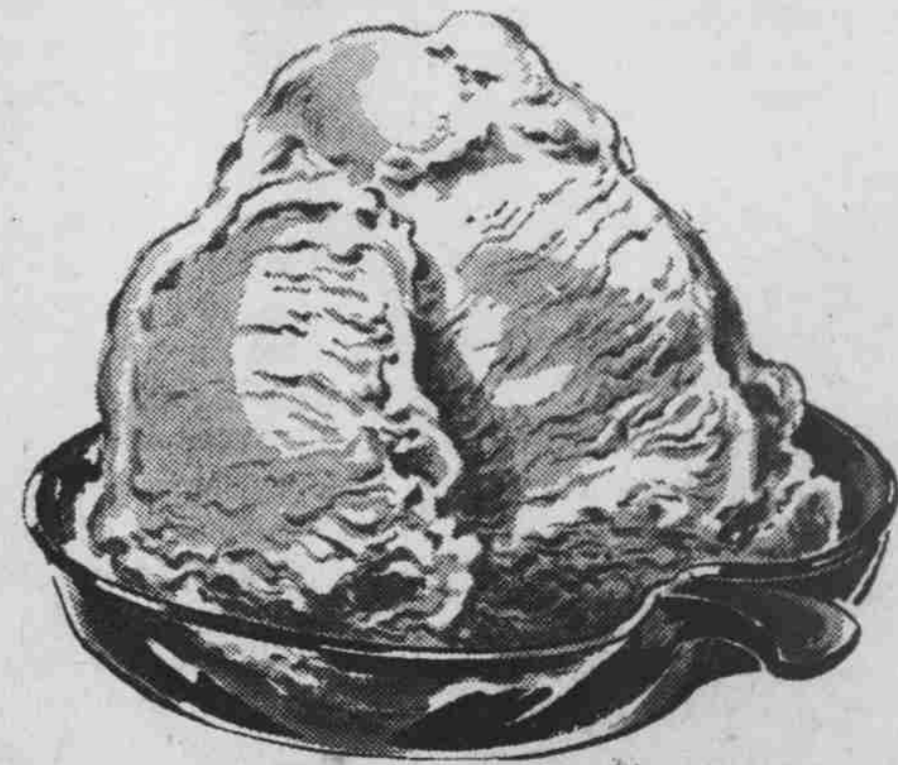
