Whiteheart Shuts Out Fort Bragg, 5-0

Locals Invade Wolfpack Lair For Tilt Today

Hurler Gets Three Hits; Ryan Triples

Monk Whiteheart, right-handed hurler from Winston-Salem, fanned 17 Fort Bragg batters and pitched four-hit ball, as the Tar Heels registered a 5-0 victory over the soldiers on Emerson Field yesterday afternoon.

Whiteheart was not only superb on the mound by not issuing any bases on balls, but the high kicking chunker cracked out three singles and drove two runs across the plate. In the third and fifth innings Whiteheart mowed down all six batters to face him.

Play State Today

The Hearnmen will travel to Raleigh this afternoon and will seek their first win against the league leading State Terrors who have handed the Tar Heels three straight setbacks. Coach Hearn will send Lefty Vinny DiLorenzo to the mound in an attempt to break the jinx. This will be the final contest between the two Big Four clubs. Jim Hayworth will be behind the plate in the only line-up change today.

Three errors accounted for three Carolina runs in the third inning. Hearn was safe on a mishap by B. Schmidt. Gregory was hit by a pitched ball. Colones was safe on an error by Rooney and Hearn scored. Frazier reached first on a bad throw by shortstop Castigle and Gregory trotted home. Colones scored on a long fly by Hackney.

The Tar Heels added another tally in the fifth frame when Rip Ryan led off with a long drive that went for a triple and crossed the plate on a long fly into centerfield by Beason.

Carolina's final run came in the sixth inning as the results of two hits and an error. Ronald Frazier was safe on Walker's error. Whiteheart lined a single into right field and Bo Hackney followed with a base hit to score Frazier.

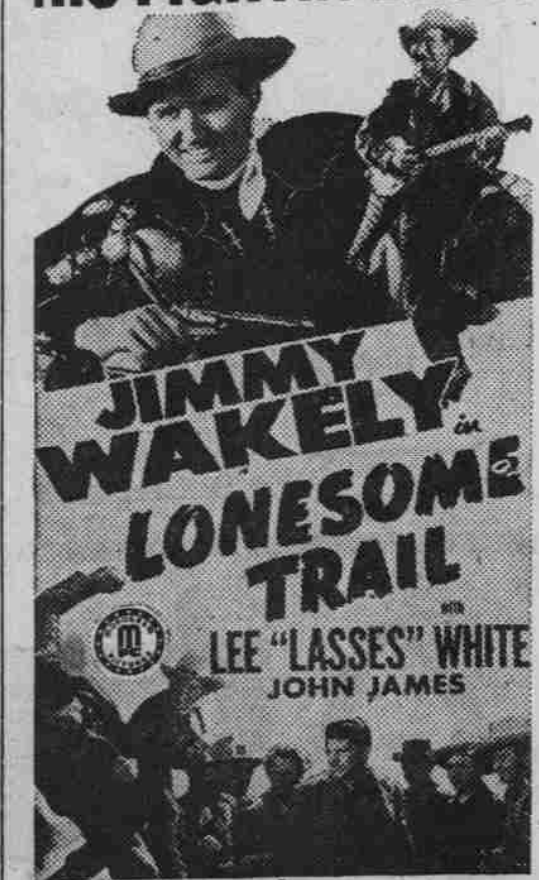

Last time out Carolina's No. 1 foursome swept 8½ of a possible nine points, but the second and third pairs could make little headway against the Blue Devils. Yesterday the second and third foursomes had the edge over their rivals, but the Tar Heels' No. one duo reversed its luck and wound up 8½-½ behind the eight ball.

Ed Bailey, playing with Graydon Liles in the No. 1 foursome, shot a 74 over the soggy course, but as luck would have it he was paired with Luke Smith, Duke Medical student, who negotiated the 18 holes in a one-over-par 71.

Comeback of the day honors went to lanky Dan Nyimicz, who staggered through the first nine holes with a sad 42, three holes down to the Blue Devil's Aiken. But he breezed around the back nine faster than Assault going down the home stretch in the Kentucky Derby, picked up four holes with a par-shattering 34, and pocketed the match, 2-1.

Bob Cox, better known as a pass-snaggin', extra point kickin' end in football, made his debut on the links today in the No. 6 position, and apparently was just what the Doctor ordered. He shot a consistent, though not sensational game in whipping Rankin, 2½-½.

The Tar Heels close out the 1946 season one-up on the 18th hole at Hope Valley next Friday afternoon against Virginia's Cavaliers. Coach Chuck Erickson and his boys hope to give the Virginians a warm reception this time as a token of appreciation for the hearty welcome they got from the Cavaliers last week. Devils Qualify 18 Runners; Carolina Places 14 in Finals

Simmons Cops Three Firsts, One Second For Tar Heels; Maxwell Captures Sprint

A power-laden Duke University track team will be in the favorite's spotlight in the 22nd annual running of the Southern conference track and field championships on Fetzer field this afternoon by virtue of qualifying 18 finalists in the trials held yesterday afternoon. The finals in the field events will get under way at 3:30, with the first track final scheduled for 4 o'clock.

The highly-touted Devils

placed four more men than Carolina in today's events. The Tar Heels qualified 14, with Maryland getting seven places, and VMI and State six each. South Carolina, W&M, Clemson, and George Washington divided the few remaining positions in a field of 60.

Strong in Hurdles

Carolina showed strength only in the hurdles, where Charlotte's Chunk Simmons won both his high and low hurdle heats and Hunter Heggie and D. Taylor also placed in both events. Simmons also took first in the javelin throw and second in the broad jump.

Duke, led by Terry Maxwell and Roger Neighborgall in the dashes, Neighborgall and Bill Simons in the half-mile, and Jim O'Leary in the shot and discus, showed evidence that they have the men capable of taking most of the first places today.

On Simmons' very able shoulders largely rest what slim chances the host team will have to defend its conference championship. Mark Burnham, who placed in the 880 yesterday and figures to win the mile this afternoon, is another key figure in Carolina's hopes.

Ward in High Jumps

Leroy Ward in the high jump and McLeod and Hickman in the pole vault are expected to add to the Tar Heel total, but Duke's strength in the middle distances and the large number of men they have in the field events will prove a large hurdle to get over, even for the Blue and White clad runners, whose greatest strength lies in the hurdles.

A few of the runners from the other visiting schools could help upset the appcart today. Maryland's Ed Matthews showed well in winning his heats in both the 220 and 440-yard dashes, while a pair of VMI Keydets, Chewning and Hutchinson, walked off with the 100-yard dash heats. State's Chambers will also bear watching in the hurdle and the dash.



Carrying Carolina's colors and hopes over the half-mile and mile distances in the Southern conference track meet on Fetzer field this afternoon will be Mark Burnham, former Dartmouth miler, who has captured several victories in the mile for the Tar Heels this spring.

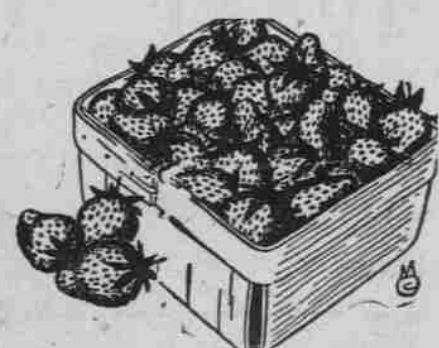

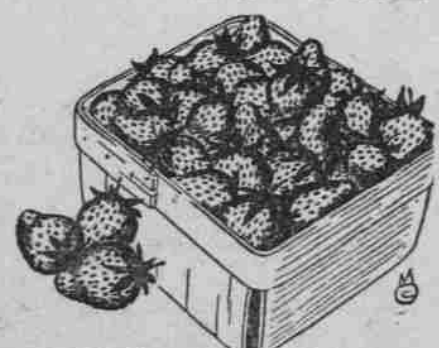
