

Tar Heel Nine Seeks Second Victory Over Fort Bragg Today

DiLorenzo Is Probable Starter Against Soldiers in Clash Here

Fort Bragg, shutout victim of Carolina in a previous contest in Emerson stadium this spring, will send another team to play the Tar Heels on the local diamond this afternoon at 4 o'clock.

The Tar Heels were sidetracked again Monday afternoon when the Deacons from Wake Forest stopped the Hearmen's three-game winning streak behind the four-hit pitching of Jake Pierce.

Vin DiLorenzo, freshman southpaw from Bergenfield, N. J., is a possible pitching choice today, although Coach Hearn's mound staff has been disrupted by the titanic 18-inning struggle with State Saturday and Monday's game that saw Carolina use three pitchers.

Pitched 12 Innings

DiLorenzo pitched 12 grueling innings against the Wolfpack in Saturday's protested Tar Heel win before being relieved by Hamp Coleman and Monday's game that saw Carolina use three pitchers.

Whiteheart, who shut out the soldiers with four hits while striking out 17 in the previous meeting between the two clubs, was batted out of the box by Wake Forest in the third inning Monday. John McElrath, another possible starter, finished up the Wake game.

State College, at present in front of the Big Four race by one game over Duke, has filed a protest over losing the marathon battle to the Tar Heels last Saturday. The situation arose in

the eighth inning when Jim Doaks, State pinch-hitter went up to bat without telling the umpire. After he had taken one ball the umpire called him out. Coach Vic Sorrell immediately announced that State was playing under protest.

Revert to Eighth

If the protest should be allowed, the game would revert to the eighth inning with Carolina leading 3-2, one State man out, and one on first base.

Carolina hitting and fielding has shown a great deal of improvement over the past week, although the hitters were calmed down again by Pierce's hurling Monday.

The Tar Heel lineup this afternoon will be the same as usual with John Gregory, John Colones, "Rip" Ryan, and John Hearn in the infield and Harry Beason, Charlie Cole, and Bo Hackney in left.

Racquetmen End Season With Impressive Record

Score 15 Victories Against One Loss; Gruner Wins 14 Contests to Lead Way

With the cancellation of yesterday's Carolina-Wake Forest tennis clash, the Tar Heels completed their 1946 campaign with an impressive record of 15 victories against one lone setback.

A look at the record also shows that nine of the Carolina triumphs were scored via the shutout route, while five of the wins

were in Southern Conference competition. Only two opposing teams were able to register more than two wins in any one match, Navy losing by a 5-4 margin and William & Mary scoring the one decision over Carolina by a 7-2 count.

Heading the Tar Heel victory parade for the season is Stan Gruner, who occupied the number three position. Gruner marked up 14 wins in 15 encounters while his doubles partner and the team's top ranking ace, Harold Maass, scored 12 triumphs in 15 outings to place second. Playing from the number four berth, Jim Nicholson registered 11 wins and two defeats, one of the latter coming by default when he injured his ankle. Sam Daniels, number two for most of the season, also scored 11 triumphs but was charged with one additional loss.

Two Undefeated Players

Two members of the team went through the campaign without dropping a match. Don Skakle maintained his unbeaten streak through 10 clashes while Ed Dameron went undefeated in eight encounters. Mel Jordan captured nine decisions while dropping two before leaving school early this month and Dick Swigart was victorious in seven of nine contests.

Maass and Gruner were the leading doubles combination, racking up 10 wins in 11 tilts. Nicholson and Skakle scored eight triumphs in nine matches and doubles specialist Duke Wilder participated in 10 doubles victories against two defeats while teaming with five different partners.

Three members of the nine-man outfit that saw action during the campaign have played in their last match for Carolina. Maass, Jordan, and Dameron have all used up their years of eligibility, while the remaining six will probably report to Coach Kenfield next season.

Manager of this year's team was Don Paley, who also managed the 1944 crew. His assistant was Bill Stubbs.
