

# Dorsett Appoints Group To Consider Complaints

### Anonymous Committee Will Review Criticism Concerning Members of University Faculty

A committee has been appointed by Dewey Dorsett, president of the student body, to take proper action on criticism made by students concerning faculty members.

Dorsett says the committee will remain anonymous so that neither members of the faculty nor student body will be able to apply any pressure.

The committee will consider both "constructive criticism and outright complaints" about professors on such phases as (1) the professor's knowledge of the course he is teaching (as determined by the student) (2) presentation of the class subject matter (3) violations of the Honor Code (such as failure of the professor to leave the class after a copy of the quiz has been handed the student) (4) methods of grading which are deemed unfair.

**Not to 'Witch Hunt'**  
President Dorsett says the purpose of the committee is not for "witch hunting," but should be constructive both for the faculty and student body. Before appointing the committee of 12 members of the student body Dorsett discussed the matter with Chancellor House, who endorsed the plan and agreed that it should be beneficial.

Criticisms, complaints, and grievances should be submitted in detailed writing to Dewey Dorsett at the ATO House since the members of the committee are to remain a secret. The student submitting the criticism should sign his name to the criticism so that he may explain any details that are not clear in the letter. Dorsett said that in discussing the details of the criticisms the names of the students submitting the criticisms would also remain anonymous.

## Morning Registration Period Cancelled Due to Convocation

### Lanier Announces Memorial Hall 'Machinery' Will Function from 2 to 4:45 o'Clock Today

"Because of the convocation this morning from 10 until 11 o'clock registration machinery in Memorial hall cannot operate before this afternoon," Central Records Director Edwin S. Lanier announced yesterday evening.

"The registration machine in Memorial hall will roll again from 2 until 4:45 o'clock this afternoon," he said. "However, students who cannot enter the hall before 3:30 o'clock will not be able to be registered today and will have to return at a later date."

In spite of the convocation individual interviews between students and their faculty advisors will continue according to schedule.

Lanier revealed that at the close of registration yesterday more than 2,000 students had been processed through the registration machine although it had been set up to handle only 600 a day.
