

# Stiff Parking Rules Go Into Effect

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## Town Police Will Enforce Regulations

University parking regulations, sharply controlling student parking in restricted campus areas, went into effect yesterday. Chapel Hill town police will enforce the rules and violators will be tried in town court.

Faced with fairly providing space for a campus car population twice the size of the available places, the University Safety Committee has enlarged the "walking zone" area. Students living within this area are not eligible to receive parking stickers that entitle drivers to use of restricted areas.

Campus areas that are restricted between 2 o'clock in the morning and 2 o'clock in the afternoon include the entire campus area bounded by East Franklin Street, South Columbia Street, Raleigh Road and Raleigh Street, except the parking areas adjacent to lower quadrangle dorms and Country Club Road from the Highway 54 intersection to the Raleigh Street intersection.

Faculty members and handicapped students have exclusive use of areas adjacent to Bynum Hall, Steele Dormitory, Carr and Caldwell; the areas from Cameron Avenue to Alumni Hall, and the lot behind Phillips Hall during restrictive hours.

A new Chapel Hill town ordinance restricts parking to one hour between 7 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening on both sides of Columbia Street from the light beside the Carolina Inn and the Franklin Street light. Speed limits on campus streets are 20 miles per hour and 15 per hour in congested areas.

## New Y Members Among Freshmen To Meet Tonight

Freshmen members of the YMCA will have their first meeting of the school year tonight at 7 o'clock in Gerrard hall.

The main purpose of the meeting is to provide an opportunity for the men attending to decide the type of program they want to carry on throughout the school year.

Bob Barrus, associate secretary of the "Y", said the program possibilities for this year include such activities as parties with freshmen girls from other colleges, class athletic contests, forum discussions on matters of interest to freshmen.

Barrus said that all freshmen who have made contributions to the "Y" are eligible for membership and those who have not yet contributed are invited to tonight's meeting to become acquainted with the program.

crete-brick constructed sarcophagus. The top of the sarcophagus has a carved illustration of the sixth and seventh verses of the 12th chapter of Ecclesiastes, "Or ever the silver cord be loosed or the golden bowl be broken, or the pitcher be broken at the cistern, then shall the dust return to the earth as it was and the spirit shall return to God who gave it."

The illustration pictures a Jerusalem scene with palm trees, a fountain, cistern, the broken pitcher and bowl, and the loosened cord. There is also a small hole leading into the inside of the structure which evidently was included to allow water to drain out of the illustration.

The inscription which is below the illustration reads: "Sacred to the memory of Lewis Bowen Holt of the County of Orange, a member of the Junior Class of the University of North Carolina, who departed this life, October 11, 1843, A.D. aged 22 years, 1 month and 5 days."
