RALEIGH, Nov. 30—(AP)—Directors of the North Carolina Automobile Dealers Association today set May 14-17 as dates of the organization's 1950 convention at Pinehurst.

Dean D. D. Carroll of the University of North Carolina School of Commerce addressed a meeting of the Association's Board of Directors. He told the dealers, "You are one of the most important links, being the vanguard of the distribution, in providing modern man with the tools and facilities for the highest standards of living that mankind has ever known."

'Commie Propaganda' Mural Is Removed By NYU Officials

NEW YORK, Nov. 30—(AP)—New York University has taken down the charcoal mural sketch that was attacked by a student faction as "vicious Communist propaganda," it was revealed today.

The job was done in the peace and quiet of the Thanksgiving Holiday while students were away on a four-day vacation. Student critics of the mural

claimed it showed a group of Russians radiantly happy in a paradise, with the Americans in the picture living in a depressing "hell hole."

School officials denied taking sides in the right and left-wing argument, and issued this statement:

"As a result of the sharp student controversy, the plant department of New York University has removed the temporary charcoal sketch of the proposed 'One World' mural on the wall of La Guardia Hall.

"The action was taken without passing judgment on its artistic or philosophic merits."

The sketch was on brown paper tacked to a wooden frame. A school official said it was carefully handled and stored.

The mural was first attacked Nov. 16 in the School of Education newspaper by a 22-year-old graduate student of philosophy, Stefan Bauer-Mengelberg.

As the result of his charges, a student meeting heard the graduate student artist, Harold Collins, defend his conception and then voted to urge a student referendum on the issue.

Collins, whose design was picked in a competition, said he "had nothing to hide" and was painting things as he saw them.

The mural is 10 by 28 feet. The Russian and American groups are reaching to grasp hands across a United Nations conference table.

The American side also features a worried looking student sitting on a fence.

Durham Favors Sharing Atom Secrets With GB

Congressman Carl Durham, of Chapel Hill, representing the Sixth North Carolina District, said last night that he favors sharing atomic energy information with England.

Addressing the Chapel Hill League of Women Voters at a public meeting in Town Hall, he said the sharing of such information will be valuable to England, Canada, and the United States.

Congressman Durham is vice-chairman of the joint Congressional Committee on Atomic Energy and a member of the Armed Services Committee of the House.

"I approve of this cooperation with Great Britain," he said, "for security reasons as outlined in the Atlantic Pact. The information will be beneficial for all three countries."

He referred also to the raw materials program established by England, Canada and the United States during World War II for the production of fissure material.

(Continued from page 1) Thursday, Jan. 3, 4, and 5, will be counted among the total number of his absences in each class during the quarter but of themselves will not bring him under academic penalty. Of course the student is responsible for any work that he has missed.

"This action has been taken on the advice of the Committee of Deans and the student representatives."

The meeting in House's office yesterday was attended by Dean of Students Bill Friday, Dean William Wells, Dean C. P. Spruill, Dean D. D. Carroll, Dr. E. M. Hedgepeth, Dr. Claiborne Jones and Central Records Director Edwin Lanier.

Students attending the meeting were President Bill Mackie, Head Cheerleader Norm Sper, Daily Tar Heel Sports Editor Billy Carmichael III, and Daily Tar Heel Managing Editor Chuck Hauser.

What the three-day-grace-on-absences proposition boils down to is this:

Students in good academic standing who go to Dallas may come back three days late. There will be no \$2.50-per-class fines for missing the first day, and no penalties for missing the second or third day.

As far as the question of class cuts after the student has taken his "Dallas special" of three is concerned, that is a matter to be settled between the individual instructor and the student. The same regulations which apply at all other times would apply here, above and beyond the three-cut maximum.

Late returners from Dallas will pick up their class tickets, as usual, from Venable X, that is, if they have signed the check cards before they left. If a student decides to go unexpectedly after he has left Chapel Hill he may wire the registration office that he is going to Dallas and will return late.
