## Missouri Comes Off Sand Bank After 15 Days

NORFOLK, Va., Feb. 1-(AP)-The battleship Missouri slid off a sand bank today with a sigh heard at Naval stations the world over.

Release from 15-day captivity on Thimble Shoal came quietly, almost before men closest to the scene knew it. But the word spread rapidly as the "Mighty Mo" edged into deep water.

The great battlewagon, historic scene of Japan's surrender, headed immediately for the Navy yard and drydocking. Experts may know within hours whether any serious damage was done. All indications have been that the Missouri was not badly hurt when she plowed a half mile upon the hard sand at the entrance to Hampton Roads.

Rear Admiral Allan E. Smith, Chief of the salvage job, radioed Admiral William H. P. Blandy, Commander in Chief of the Atlantic Fleet, at 7:09 a. m.: "Missouri reports for duty.

Seven fathoms of water under her keel."

Military terseness ignored the drama.

Smith was shouting success in the biggest salvage job of his life.

Blandy was getting back, only two hours before retirement, the nation's only commissioned battleship.




