

# Missouri Comes Off Sand Bank After 15 Days

NORFOLK, Va., Feb. 1—(AP)—The battleship Missouri slid off a sand bank today with a sigh heard at Naval stations the world over.

Release from 15-day captivity on Thimble Shoal came quietly, almost before men closest to the scene knew it. But the word spread rapidly as the "Mighty Mo" edged into deep water.

The great battlewagon, historic scene of Japan's surrender, headed immediately for the Navy yard and drydocking. Experts may know within hours whether any serious damage was done. All indications have been that the Missouri was not badly hurt when she plowed a half mile upon the hard sand at the entrance to Hampton Roads.

Rear Admiral Allan E. Smith, Chief of the salvage job, radioed Admiral William H. P. Blandy, Commander in Chief of the Atlantic Fleet, at 7:09 a. m.: "Missouri reports for duty. Seven fathoms of water under her keel."

Military terseness ignored the drama.

Smith was shouting success in the biggest salvage job of his life.

Blandy was getting back, only two hours before retirement, the nation's only commissioned battleship.

# Reds Ask For Hirohito Trial Of War Crimes

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1—(AP)—Russia demanded today that Emperor Hirohito be tried as a war criminal.

The demand was presented to Secretary of State Acheson in a 22 page note delivered by Soviet Ambassador Alexander S. Panyushkin.

It is understood that the note also asked war criminal trials for several other Japanese officials, but their identities were not immediately made known.

Panyushkin did not get an instant reply from Acheson during the seven minutes he was in the Secretary's office. State Department experts set to work translating the Kremlin message from Russian into English and said that the document would have to be studied carefully before a reply was made.

The Russians were officially in war with the Japanese for only a short time—about a week—before the end of hostilities in August, 1945.

During the peace, Gen. Douglas MacArthur has allowed the diminutive emperor to remain in office as a token ruler. Since the war's end, little evidence of the Japanese imperialistic attitude has remained with Hirohito.

# Senate Votes To Abolish Vote College

WASHINGTON, Feb. 1—(AP)—The Senate today accepted by voice vote a change in the proposed constitutional amendment to revise the system of electing Presidents and Vice Presidents.

Offered by Senate Democratic leader Lucas (Ill.), it would require that a winning Presidential candidate get at least 40 percent—or a total of 212.4—of all the nation's 531 electoral votes.

There is one electoral vote for each member of Congress. Each state has an electoral vote equal to the total of its senators and representatives.

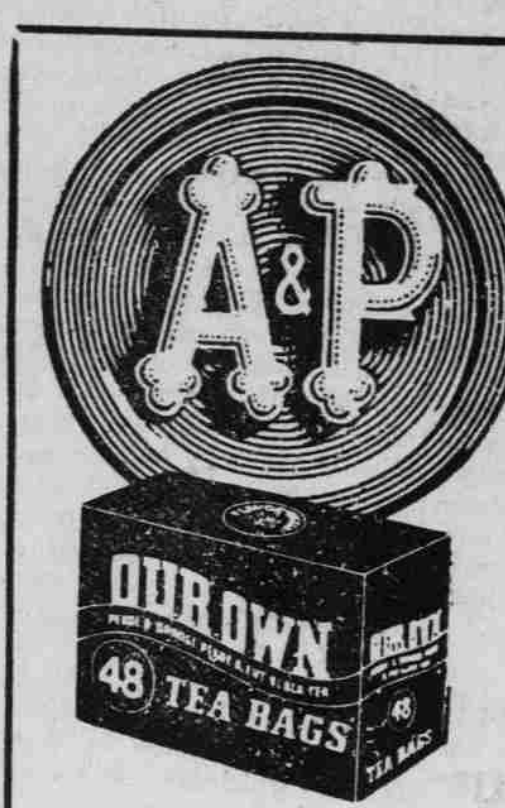
