In keeping with the National Brotherhood Week, the Wesley Foundation will be host at a supper and program Sunday night from 6 to 8 o'clock for the Hillel Foundation here on campus, a group of girls from the Greensboro College Wesley Foundation, several Negro students from the North Carolina College, and any other interested students on campus.

Under the direction of Rabbi Theodore Freedman of the Anti-Defamation League and B'nai B'rith, this novel pageant will feature Protestants portraying Jews, and Jews portraying Protestants as well as white students portraying Negroes, and colored students portraying whites—all with the intention of letting those present imagine themselves in the place of others.

Harry Samet and Herb Nachman, both of Hillel, will conduct a worship service in both English and Hebrew. As usual for Wesley Foundation meetings, all interested persons of all denominations will be welcomed for the supper at 6 p. m. and the program at 7 p. m.
