

Special Buses Will Leave Last Day Of Classes To Transport Students To Three Large Cities

Special buses to three large cities will leave Chapel Hill at 6 o'clock Thursday, March 16, to take students home for spring vacation, Charles Ufen, manager of the Graham Memorial Travel Agency, said yesterday.

Although each of the buses will be headed for one primary point, each one will make stops at as many as eight different points between Chapel Hill and the final destinations.

One set of buses—the number making the trip will be determined by the number of students making reservations—will go to New York by way of Richmond, Fredericksburg, Washington, Baltimore, Philadelphia, Trenton, New Brunswick and Newark.

Another set of buses with Asheville as their destination will make stops at Statesville, Hickory, Morganton, Marion, and Black Mountain.

The third set of buses will make stops at Rocky Mount, Suffolk, Portsmouth and Norfolk.

Reservations can be made at the Travel Agency anytime before Tuesday, March 14. Tickets may be picked up in the Travel Agency between 4:30 and 7 o'clock Wednesday, March 15.

Buses will leave Chapel Hill from the parking lot behind Graham Memorial. On the return trip buses will leave Monday, March 20 from the Dixie Hotel Bus Depot in New York, 13th

and Filbert Street Bus Depot in Philadelphia and from regular Trailways bus terminals in the other towns.

The complete schedule for these buses and for any other buses, trains or plains may be obtained from the Travel Agency, which will be open every afternoon except Saturday and Sunday through Thursday, March 16.

Moving into the balloting for Student Legislature nominations, the UP named Bill Rhodes by acclamation for one of the two available seats in Men's Town District one. Voting was delayed on the remaining seat in the district.

Allen Tate and Bill Skinner were nominated for two 12-month Legislature terms from Men's Town District two.

Party Chairman Paul Roth, Biff Roberts, and Jack Owens received UP nominations for three 12-month Legislature terms from Men's Town District three.

ticle that would prevent persons presenting testimony before the Honor Council to sit as judge in the same case.

Also passed was an amendment to make it harder for proposed amendments to the Constitution from going before the student body for vote, as required. The

amendment made it necessary for a two-thirds majority of the Legislature to pass an amendment before it could go to a campus vote, rather than the simple majority called for in the original.

Defeated was an amendment to set up separate dance regulation groups under the Dance Committee, for the Law and Medical Schools.
