

# Civil War Outcome Is Subject Of Phi

Sweet strains of "Dixie" rang through the Philanthropic Assembly Hall Tuesday night as the members took to singing after almost two hours of spirited debate on whether or not the South won the Civil War, the Assembly said yesterday.

The Jaycees have been active during the past year in several community efforts, serving in the Red Cross and Community Chest Drives, and assisted with the presentation of the March of Dimes basketball game held here this winter.

A carefree Phi Assembly rejected bill after bill until Hamilton Horton introduced a "Southern Victory" resolution which declared that the South—despite its technical defeat—actually won the War Between the States.

After nearly two hours of discussion, Horton's resolution was finally defeated when the acting Speaker George Rodman refused to break the tie vote on the issue.

A bill recognizing the United States government in Washington, introduced by Louis Rabil, was passed after the advocates for the Horton resolution conceded that the results of the Civil War would remain—as generally recorded by history.

Horton's resolution was immediately attacked by opponents as being "highly irregular" and "possibly unconstitutional." Rodman ruled the resolution "in order," and debate continued.

Opponents quoted everything from a letter written by former United States Vice President Rufus King, a Phi alumnus, to century-old Society minutes as they tried to "verify history's claims."
