Sex Survey Gets Editor Suspension

LONDON, May 15-(P)-The student editor of a Polytechnic Institute magazine was kicked out of school for a month today for trying to circulate a sex questionnaire.


The questionnaire aimed at 15,-000 students was suppressed.

Governors of the institute suspended Ian Kerr, 24, because he planed to ask students 20 ques-

tions on religion, morals and sex, "This questionnaire may be some sort of idea of the Kinsey report," -said John C. Jones, Poly's Director of Education. Jones said the questionnaire

asked such questions as: "Do you believe in free love?"

"Do you think your moral behavior has been lowered by student life?"




