

Sex Survey Gets Editor Suspension

LONDON, May 15—(AP)—The student editor of a Polytechnic Institute magazine was kicked out of school for a month today for trying to circulate a sex questionnaire.

The questionnaire aimed at 15,000 students was suppressed.

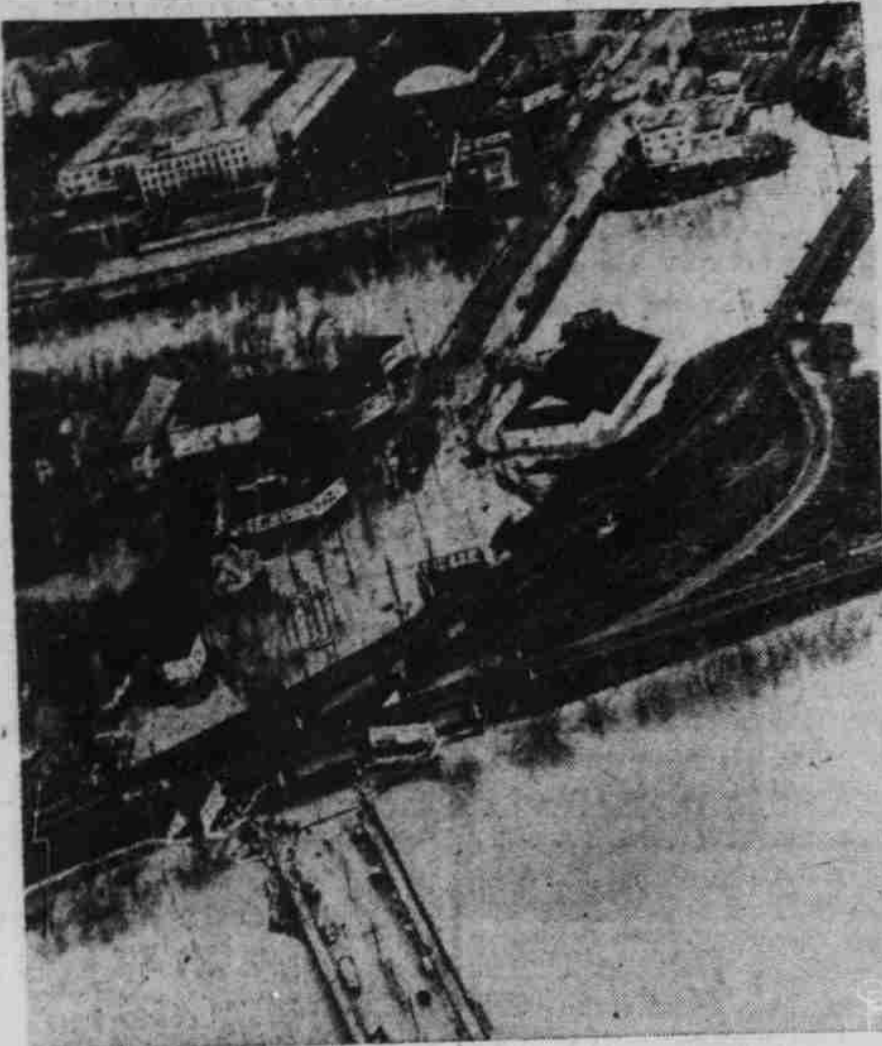
Governors of the institute suspended Ian Kerr, 24, because he planned to ask students 20 questions on religion, morals and sex.

"This questionnaire may be some sort of idea of the Kinsey report," said John C. Jones, Poly's Director of Education.

Jones said the questionnaire asked such questions as:

"Do you believe in free love?"

"Do you think your moral behavior has been lowered by student life?"

McCarthy said Lattimore "masterminded" American strategy in the Pacific and "Mr. Acheson has bought it and applied it to the entire Far East."

The Lattimore plan, McCarthy said, coincides with Russian strategy to make the Pacific a "Red Lake."

Some 300 delegates and their wives cheered McCarthy when he said "Mr. Truman, the time has come to stop your whistle stop campaigning and come home."

The senator said: "Come on home, Mr. Truman, you have a lot to do. Tell Mr. Jessup, for instance, that this government no longer has a place for men whose organization takes money from Communists."

The Mouza will offer both cafeteria and dining room service and has a capacity of 120 seats. A large parking lot has been provided at the rear of the building.

"We are stressing quality in food, and the place will be run for the students' benefit to suit their needs and their pocket-books," Stefanou pointed out.
