Their motive, said Bernard De Voto and A. B. Guthrie Jr., was revenge. The victim was Navy Commander William J. Lederer, author of "All the Ships at Sea."  
The trio have been retracing the route of the old Oregon Trail which furnished subject matter for "Across the Wide Missouri," De Voto's prize winner in 1947 and "The Way West" which won Guthrie a Pulitzer prize in 1949.
